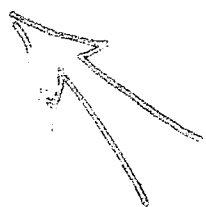

Motion to accept election results approved 9-0

Olivieri, Simhoff, Molden constitute the parking comm. & made the decision to do away with the Baker parking lot when a near accident occurred in front of the infirmary- later in the evening George Doerre mentioned that the administration could have just as easily placed 4 P.R. ties in front of the infirmary & some flowers & cut down the # of parking spaces from say 14 to 10. Mitchell agreed but said that this is one hassle that he'd rather not get involved in.

Mitchell mentioned the possibility of Baker having its own linen service. It would cost around \$1300 to set up but would net an additional \$750-\$1000/yr after the first year.

Totkin said that 2 people indicated interest in running the snack bar: Herb Newborn & Ken Rosa. It looks like we'll only be selling malts (which is probably just as well since hamburgers & fries seemed to always run at a loss). \$420 was appropriated for the 5th floor East party but no girls came so actual losses only ran about \$7.50.

Grievances

Porter Situation- Mitchell said that we should avoid sensationalism in our agendas especially in what appears to be a delicate issue such as porters. Celentano brought up the fact that sensationalism was not used in the agenda for the House Meeting but instead was used in the Execcom minutes to urge people to get their shit out of the halls. Mark recognized the fact that sensationalism at times seems necessary to get people to read minutes & agendas let alone come down to the meetings.

Celentano also mentioned that this place should not be a rehabilitation institution but should be kept clean since we're paying to keep this place clean. The institute should take some active responsibility in helping porters with problems.

Polatnick wanted to know why windows aren't washed in Baker. It seems that union contracts are the culprit. Doerre mentioned the fact that it doesn't have to be that way and we should not accept such agreements which shun responsibility.

Art Beals told Mitchell that the furniture was delivered to Baker!!!!!!

Fred Gross is looking into the maintenance situation. Arthur seems to be taking an enormous unmanageable load- How about nominating him for the Best Employee of the Year Award?

Totkin Motion to put money in agenda for speakers passed unanimously

Why doesn't Baker do the same with COOP living? Celentano mentioned getting a kitchen set up at Baker but the point was made that if we're going to get a kitchen it should be for Bakerites and not simply to allure Wellesley girls.
