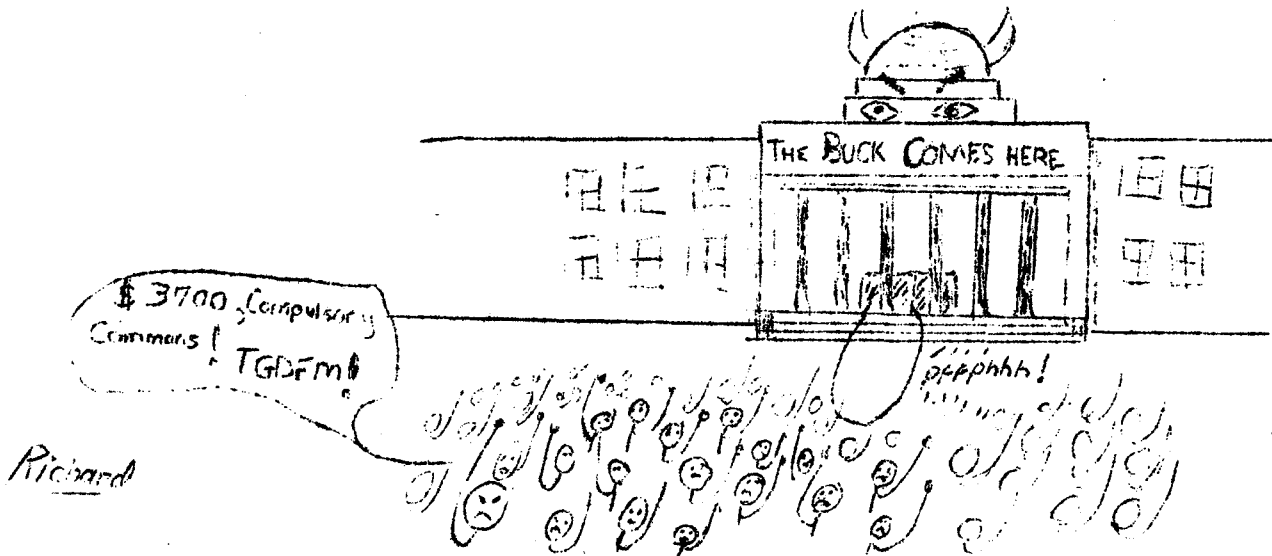

IN EXPOSED!

A new form of signal processing(in addition to AM,FM And PM),has been discovered by researchers at Baker House. It(for Terrible Modulation) can send signals up to 50 meters clearly.The signal producing device, a set of vibrating cords in an air cavity, is called a "mouth". The "mouth" is portable. 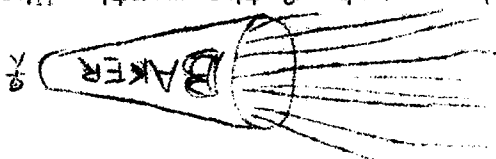

DROP DATE IS FRIDAY.

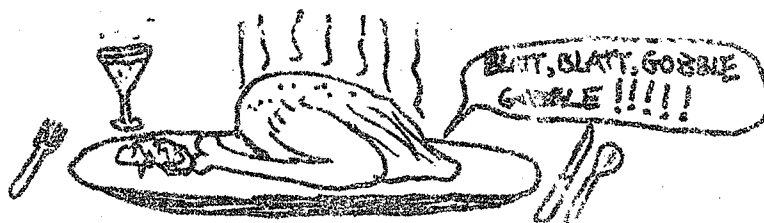
