washcomm Salary: Proposed \$10/week + free laundry, during the term; keeps machines clean and working and etc. Motion for whatever; 18-21 Fails recount called for; 28-18 passes

GA Reps: Larry Kahn's being discriminated "Let's send his whole body!" Gary will appoint anyone who wants to be it; if more than 8, then a general election will be held.

Charging Residents for Drinks: "It just doesn't feel right to pay in my own house"--But a glass of Moody punch is 28¢ and lots of them never get consumed. last party; \$458.02 spent plus \$160 revenue. Motion to give Potter a vote of confidence and is allowed to sell at no more than cost; 31-18 passes-- Leftovers are saved (mostly) and get used later on--especially with liquor and bottle beer.

House Tax: MJ recommended \$26/year (\$13/term) in order to keep our budgets as high as they are. We have no more slush left over from previous years (we're spending your money better). The surplus has worked itself out. Alan spoke in memory of John Chisholm: "flame on!" Motion to accept recommendation; 31-20 passes

Budget money for washing machine from depreciation fund: The transmission is busted; its past its warranty and at least we'll get a trade-in. Motion to budget and app. \$700 for new machine; oo-6

Rates Review: Honorable Greg Blonder presiding. Rents will be raised 7.8% (\$80/yr) laundry service cut (only 60/2000 used is) Now the big stuff: Dining Service is going broke and somehow it is going to be kept afloat. Here are the 5 basic plans:

- 1) Put increase on top of present costs
- 2) "once-thru" plan at Lebdell; small effect on our costs
- 3) MIF absorb deficit now and later increase to cover that deficit
- 4) Compulsory Commons--which we can eliminate from our stand
- 5) Have a fixed overhead cost--charge each week campus resident \$200 (already \$50) to cover base costs. Then any food plan, whether partial or full, will be only food costs (\$450+150 increase--\$600/week--\$20/week for 15 meal plan). But there are a few things they forgot; present dining halls can hold only 700 while there are 2300 of us.
(turn over for more goodies)

So costs would probably increase another \$150 for each additional dininghall. Another objective that Greg thought up was to change the type of food and maybe reduce cost (more veggies than meat)

Motion to spread cost thruout the whole system as our recommendation to Greg falls 22-30. The deans and housing will do what they want to in the end. Greg and the rest of the view can be considered and recommendation body with no real power. Also, this \$600/year seems extremely low; 2 years ago when on comp.com. cost was \$600/yr. "They served food back then"

Motion to instruct Greg that House rejects plan for next year, we want concrete figures by next fall, and that we tentatively accept in principle the idea of base cost and small food costs; 30-24 passes. Now to let Greg do what he thinks best; 4-00 fails.

Motion to reduce food cost and let Institute absorb base cost 37-15 passes (on to more interesting subjects)

CAMBRIDGE HEALTH INSPECTORS: They went into MacGregor and found enough fines for \$100/day if they levy them (Mac doesn't clean them up). These guys will inspect the dorms before April when our license comes up for renewal. Now this guy is new and doesn't know any better yet-he thinks he has to enforce the rules. But they found stuff from the reasonable (blockage of hallways) to the questionable (dirty dishes in sink). Now he does have the legal right to enter any room when searching for health violations. So he can't do anything about your 2 tons of dope "unless it catches on fire"-it's not illegal to have a hotplate if its not used for cooking, a frig if there's no food in it, is no unapproved kitchens (no, they won't inspect our kitchens). We have three options: 1) Comp.Com. 2) a laser at the front door 3) set our own safety standards and try to win the inspector to our side-not even the law, just show that it's a bit unreasonable for us. Motion for a House official policy to upgrade safety standards and try to persuade inspector to our side: 64-2 passes. So now we decide on a list of safety rules; Remove: 1) recycling cartons 2) hall blockages 3) magazines and papers in the halls 4) everything from the electrical closets 4) any boxes in the halls or near flammable stuff in your room 5) all flammables from your room--Kitchens: 1) get them clean (impressions will be important) 2) properly store your food 3) electrical wiring; a) extension cords should be rated for appliances b) 1 plug for 1 socket c) be neat! (we're lucky our circuit breakers are old-they won't always blow!) BIGGEST facot: 1) hotplates-nothing (including posters) can be above it and ideally they should be built into metal or slate slabs. 2) broiler ovens sometimes they flame on-don't store anything on them Sinks: 1) clean 2) use the drain traps (they are at the desk) Heaters: get flammable stuff off of the radiators (and meltable) Refrigs: if they in the hall keep them away from exits and main thruways (remove them from the most eastern section of each hall)

"So if we are going to have fires, they should start in the rooms, not in the halls" All of this stuff is really hazardous and we're just lucky we haven't had more problems.

Enforcement: Motion for Judcom and floor fire wardens to be an advisory committee on safety: 29-4 passes

So these guys will simply make suggestions, not inflict pain.

Motion to Recess until Sunday and take up where we left off regarding rules (I know that I said "no more")
