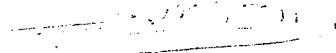

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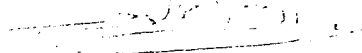

At the February Baker House Meeting, the following motion was passed:

STERILITY DISCOVERED AT MIT (or IT'S A WHACKY WORLD!)

CAMBRIDGE, May 5 — Researchers at the Department of Reproductive Convalescence released the results of a survey taken at MIT last month. A campus-wide poll showed that a disproportionate incidence of sterility exists at one dormitory.

Baker House residents were among the most sterile humans ever documented according to the report. Only the medieval eunuchs were moreso.
